The UN General Assembly has declared this as a day devoted to strengthening the ideals of peace.

As people of faith, we understand the profound significance of fostering peace and justice in our world. In solidarity with the global community, we are organizing a day of prayer dedicated to various important topics that align with our *Laudato Si'* values.

The program entails dedicating time to silent prayer to reflect on specific subjects. Each individual, community, or organization is invited to hold their own event, at a location and time which is most convenient to you. We have designed the program with a suggested schedule that will commence at 8:00 AM and conclude at 4:00 PM, allowing each of us to participate at a convenient time within this duration.

To aid you in your prayer, we have prepared an hourly guide to lead you through the day, including

- a brief prayer for each hour's topic to serve as a starting point (However, we encourage you to spend additional time in personal contemplation, offering your own intentions, petitions, and reflections on the specific subject.),
- a list of additional resources to learn more about the issues of each hour,
- suggested actions you can take to help bring about the change needed in the world, and
- a reflective YouTube video for each hour's topic.

We believe that our collective prayers can ignite transformative change, manifesting God's love and compassion in our world. The power of prayer knows no bounds, and by participating, we join hands in creating a ripple effect of peace that extends beyond our immediate community.
