
What We **Provide**



- Financial Reimbursement.
- Ongoing positive parenting training, resources and peer led support groups.
- Day care, child care and respite assistance
- Medical, dental, and prescription coverage for foster children
- Behavioral health services and crisis support; help the children's healing and strengthening foster family support.
- Children who are adopted qualify for an adoption subsidy.

Basic Requirements



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- You don't need to be married, own your home, earn a high income, or have previous parenting experience.
- You're never too old to be a foster parent, but you must be a minimum of 21 years old.
- Provide a safe, loving and nurturing home with sufficient space and privacy for a foster child.
- Be able to attain a Level 1 Fingerprint Clearance Card from the Department of Public Safety. Full list

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Why Become a foster or adoptive parent?

 Every child deserves a loving and nurturing home.

- Every year in Arizona approximately 3,600 children are removed from their homes and need a place to stay.
- There are currently **14,00 children** in care in Arizona.
- More than **1,400** children are currently in group homes.
- Sibling groups often all children have for support, are traumatized even further if separated and placed into different homes.
- Pima County has seen a large increase of children coming into foster care. Homes are needed to care for children of all ages until reunification with their bio families if possible.

Types of Foster Care

Regular Foster Care

Foster care provides children with the stability and love they need during challenging times. By becoming a foster care parent, you offer a full time safe haven where a child can grow, heal, and thrive. It's an opportunity to make a life-changing impact, giving hope and support to children and families when they need it most.

Your kindness and dedication can help shape a brighter future for a child, turning their challenges into possibilities and help increase successful reunifications.

Therapeutic

Therapeutic foster care (TFC) is a paid foster care arrangement that provides a safe, structured, and nurturing environment for children and young people with medical, emotional, behavioral, or mental health needs.

Respite

Respite care offers caregivers a vital break, providing them with the time to rest and recharge. By becoming a respite care provider, you make a meaningful difference in someone's life, offering support when it's needed most.

Though the pay is minimal, the rewards are profound—your compassion and dedication bring comfort and relief to families, making a real and lasting impact in your community.
